### HIGH SCHOOL CREDITS

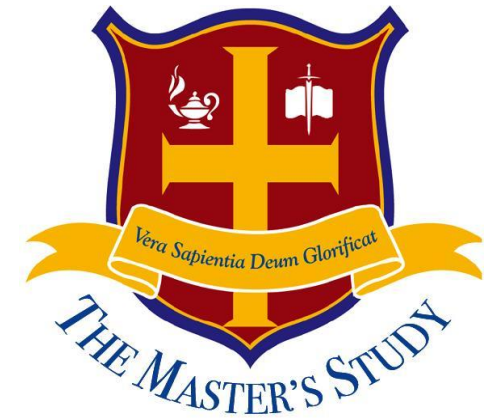

## What is THE MASTER'S STUDY?

The Master's Study is a classically minded homeschool tutelage that enhances and equips the home school family with high school aged students. Through the lens of a Christian world view, the tutors teach and encourage students in the study of the core humanities while encouraging further growth in elective areas of study. Such endeavors are pursued with the thread of God's truth at the core.

The TMS High-School program operates under a modified university model, meeting twice weekly. Classroom time is focused on subject clarification, in-depth Socratic discussion, and laboratory-style experiences. TMS assignments and coursework are tutor-driven.

### CORE CLASSES

High school students at The Master's Study enroll in not just one class but a set of core classes based on the Humane Letters approach. These courses, sprinkled with a hint of classical studies, include history, literature, and composition.

### ELECTIVE CLASSES

As a student grows in the study of the core classes, other areas of study find relevance in the high school curricula as well. These include sciences, math, and languages. Elective classes are demand driven.

## Frequently Asked Questions



### Why would I want my student to be part of a "classical" model?

In today's world, most teens have the talent of arguing: few know *how* to make an argument. The ability to make an argument is a process that matures just as the student does. Academic rigor, balanced with personal challenge and appreciation for timeless elements of classical studies are hallmarks of classical education.

### You talk about "Classical Christian" – but don't offer a Bible class? Why?

Laced within the course of study is an opportunity to look for Truth and the hand of God in the history of man. Our students learn to see history through the lens of both the godly and ungodly, and read literature from both a modern and a Christian world view. They see the wonder of His hand in science and math. The tutorial staff at The Master's Study seeks to point the students back to God's ageless truths in all areas of study. TMS doesn't offer a Bible class... it IS a Bible class.

### You talk about a "university model"? What exactly is that?

In a traditional model, a student partakes in ALL of the subject studies upon enrollment. In a university model, a student elects into classes, one by one. Enrollment in TMS places a student directly into a "core" of classes with "electives" in order to maximize the benefits of a classical education while providing student flexibility.

**Can I enroll my student in the CORE alone?**  
Of course!

### Can I enroll in just an elective?

No. For participation in the TMS tutelage community, all students are required to enroll in the TMS humanities core.

### Why "require" a core? Why not make everything an elective?

The TMS core is exactly what one might think it is: the core of study – the heart of classical education. Core subjects, studied together, are an essential tool that shapes the learning environment and student community. To make every subject an elective dilutes that environment and impacts the community in other areas of study. By requiring a core, we maintain the grounded, academically-rich, Christ-centered community that defines TMS.

### What if I only want to enroll in one elective.... And I have 'dead space' on my schedule?

TMS is happy to have students use "spare time" as an opportunity for Study Tables – solo or in small groups.

### How will I know if TMS is for me?
